

1-3 DAY SHORT-TERM JAIL STAY

FOR THE

YELLOW LINE PROJECT

Individual booked into jail

Individual participates in YLP screening process

LE officer, individual and screener agree YLP is a possible option

CBC meets with individual prior to initial court hearing to determine level of YLP engagement and completes "Level of Engagement" form



If individual meets criteria for level of engagement, CBC completes "YLP Short-Term (1-3 Days) Jail Stay Notification to County Attorney's Office" form



If individual does not meet level of engagement criteria, YLP eligibility ends

CBC emails CAO form to designated CAO Outlook email address 'All Detainer Attorneys' prior to 10:00 a.m. on the day of the initial court hearing

CAO considers YLP participation as possible condition of release or in furtherance of treatment



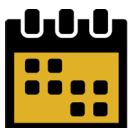
If CAO recommends, and Judge orders YLP participation with/without bail conditions, CBC meets with individual prior to release to complete YLP Safety Plan and schedule initial YLP meeting



If CAO or Judge does not grant YLP participation to the individual, YLP eligibility ends. CBC notifies individual



If the individual's MI or CD needs become urgent or emergent while incarcerated, CBC consults with supervisor to consider as an exception case for on-site YLP support and navigation to Human Services programs



If bail is set, individual has until the end of the next business day to meet the conditions for release



If client released, CBC provides YLP services to the individual



If bail is set and individual unable to meet the conditions of bail, YLP eligibility ends.
